# **Latest Updates**

We are approaching the end of the Spring Term, with our last day being Friday 8th April. There have been many exciting events since our last newsletter, some of which you can read more about within this newsletter. As well as those detailed within the letter: Year 5 and Year 6 have both had Outdoor learning days, with Year 3 and Year 1 having them planned for this week. All year groups got involved with Science week carrying out different experiments on biscuits! Years 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 have all engaged with various author events that have taken place over Zoom run by Read bookshop in Holmfirth. As well as earning lots of books for themselves, which will go out before Easter, we were able to order just over £2000 worth of books for school to replenish the library and reading books in school. We will be launching these new books within school after the Easter break.



Staff and pupils had a fantastic day celebrating **World Book Day**. Everyone put in the effort to get dressed up and classes spent time in class on fun reading activities. We also had two teams of four Year 6 pupils in the Kirklees World Book Day Quiz which took place at Huddersfield Town Hall. It was lovely to return to this event in person; our teams did very well and one of our pupils came home with the best costume award!

In order to help promote reading and encourage children to read, it helps if the adults around them can be good role models. To support this, we have set up a bookshelf in the main entrance of school that will be a free **library service** for parents, carers and staff in our school community. We would welcome any donations of books for this service and any adults connected to our school community are welcome to borrow books to enjoy. It will completely run on trust, there is no requirement to sign out books; we just ask that you only borrow what you need at any one time and return them once you are finished with them. 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# **Class Photos - Wednesday 4th May**

On the above date, all classes in school will have a 'traditional' style class photograph. This means that if your child normally has PE on Wednesday, they will need to come in their normal school uniform, NOT PE uniform. It is very important that on this day pupils are all in full uniform, as they should be on all non-PE days. Children will still get to have active lessons on this day so they are not missing out on their activity.

#### **Blue Badge Parking**

Access to the car park is permitted for parents or carers with a blue badge in the following circumstances: The badge must belong to the parent/carer responsible for bringing or collecting the child/children.

The badge must be shown to the school office so we can take a copy for our records.

The person named on the blue badge must be the sole person in the car, otherwise the other adult should be able to get out and collect the pupil from further afield.

The person named on the blue badge must have to leave the car to go and pick up the child from their class-room door.

If collecting older pupils who could safely walk to an area close to school but outside of the car park (e.g. up Rowley Lane), parents or carers with blue badges should not need to enter the car park.

We cannot guarantee a parking space for all blue badge holders. If there is no space, please do not leave cars in places that are not allocated parking spaces or on the grass.

#### **COVID Updates**

Below is advice copied directly from the Government website:

If a child or young person has a **positive COVID-19 test result** they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower.

If you have symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as COVID-19, and you have a high temperature or do not feel well enough to go to work or carry out normal activities, try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people, until you no longer have a high temperature (if you had one) or until you no longer feel unwell.

#### **Sporting News**

This term we have a number of sporting events to celebrate and it has been fantastic to get back into these after such a long time.

A team of Year 4 boys took part in a small football competition against other primary schools that was held here at Rowley Lane. The event was for people of all abilities. Our pupils worked well as a team and came first overall. There was also a similar girls football competition for Year 3 & 4—in this event we had two teams who both were excellent. One of our teams finished second overall.

Unfortunately the Kirklees cross country final had to be cancelled twice because of the weather which meant

that selection for the Yorkshire finals was done based on the results of the heat. 17 pupils from Rowley Lane were selected for the final, a team of year 3 boys; a team of year 4 girls, an individual girl in Year 5 and an individual boy in Year 6. We are delighted to announce that our Year 3 boys team came 2nd overall and our Year 5 girl runner came 2nd overall and earned a place in the national finals. Well done to all of our pupils who represented school this term in sporting events. We are also really pleased that the school games organisers have decided to reschedule the Kirklees Final that was thwarted by the weather. This will now take place on Tuesday 3rd May and all pupils who were due to run in the original
